Deputy Minister of Higher Education Datuk Mustapha Sakmud, in his speech at the launching of UCSI University-WAMC partnership on academic-industry collaboration, lauded the university's commitment to excellence where it is ranked in the world's top 1% in QS World University Rankings.

Mustapha deemed the partnership as timely as Malaysia is experiencing a tourism boom with the arrival of over 7.56 million foreign tourists to the country in the first quarter of 2024, a 27.5 per cent increase from the previous year.

"The booming sector is expected to contribute RM198.7 billion to Malaysia's economy in 2024, surpassing pre-pandemic levels and accounting for 10.5 per cent of the national gross domestic product (GDP) growth,"

he said, citing a report from the Ministry of Tourism, Arts and Culture.

In this regard, he said the growth in tourism would provide immense employment opportunities for Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) graduates.

"While tourism is flourishing, we must ensure that our local talent in the hospitality industry is adequately trained to meet international standards through industry-academia collaborations," he said.
